

BRYANT MAUK MEMORIAL LIBRARY

The Bryant Mauk Memorial Library is a resource for Adult Religious Education, provided without charge to the congregation of First Unitarian Universalist Church. The library is maintained by volunteer members of the church.

USING THE LIBRARY

- Select the items you wish to borrow. Complete a Check-out form and place it in the basket marked "Checked-Out."
- Items may be borrowed for three weeks, then renewed for a second three-week period. Items may not be borrowed for longer than this without permission of a volunteer Librarian.
- To return items, place them in the container marked "Returned Items." Do not re-shelve items.

BORROWER RESPONSIBILITIES

- The Mauk Memorial Library depends on borrowers feeling responsible for caring for borrowed materials. Please treat this collection with the same respect you would give to any library book. Should an item be lost or damaged, the borrower is responsible for replacing it.

DONATIONS ARE WELCOME

- Place your donations in the container marked "Donated Items," not on the shelves. A volunteer librarian will catalog and shelve the items. You may request a tax receipt for donations from the Church office.

The Mauk Memorial Library was founded in 2008 by Helen Mauk, as a memorial to her late husband, Bryant Mauk. Both Helen and Bryant were active and beloved members of First UU. Helen donated bookcases and Bryant's extensive collection of books and audiovisual materials on a wide range of topics including science, medical care, philosophy, theology, and world religions.
