Getting Ready for the New Church-school Year

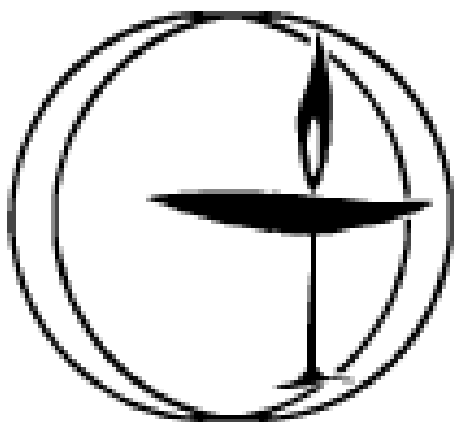


On Aug. 21, children and youth thoroughly cleaned their classrooms!
