A LETTER TO OUR CONGREGATIONAL FAMILY AND FRIENDS AT FIRST UNITARIAN UNIVERSALIST CHURCH OF SAN ANTONIO

(from the Reopening Task Force)
July 20, 2020

At the end of May, your Board of Trustees appointed a Task Force made up of some healthcare members from the congregation and Board. We were charged with coming up with a plan to reopen the church as soon and as safely as possible. As you know, the entire church campus remains closed, including courtyard and playground, until further notice. The Task Force has met regularly to determine under what conditions we could reopen. We do not expect any changes in the near future, but we are monitoring criteria and will inform the congregation of any changes to the status.

We have tentatively agreed to a phased reopening. These phases are Baseline and Phases 1, 2, and 3. We are in Baseline presently and for the immediate future. The attached spreadsheet will give you an idea of the criteria for moving to the next phase. We presently have the first two phases complete; Baseline (where we are presently) and Phase one. We are still working on Phases 2 and 3.

This is a fluid procedure and we will be revisiting these phases on a continuing basis and revising as per State of Texas, Bexar County and cities of San Antonio and Balcones Heights advise. We will keep the congregation regularly informed as things change. Our primary concern is for the safety of you and your family and the safety of the staff. No matter what we decide, it will always be with you in mind.
